









Advanced Aviation Education Programme (Helicopter) 2025-26 Integrated Aviation Programme

1. Programme's Aim and Objectives

Founded in 2003, this non-profit making/self-financed integrated aviation programme aims to introduce the world of aviation to those who wish to learn more about the pilot training, latest aviation technology and development.

The objectives are to introduce and to promote a prospective pilot's:

- Attitude (Willingness to share, considerates, respect to others, etc)
- Discipline (Punctuality, compliance with rules and regulations, etc)
- Habit (Read aviation weather, aviation news, self-consciousness on health, etc)
- Mindset (Passion in flying, creativity, plan for possible emergency, 5P, positive thinking, etc)
- Communication (Effective communication skill, proficiency in English speaking and listening, etc)

With reference to Australian Private Pilot Licence (PPL), Commercial Pilot Licence (CPL) and Airline Transport Pilot Licence (ATPL) training syllabi, the programme aims to provide a wide range of pilot, fixed-wing and helicopter knowledge

2. Eligibility

The programme is open to HKACC members, UOW College HK students and the general public aged 18 or above. (Applicants from public are required to enroll as HKACC Associate Member upon successful admission to the programme) A reasonable understanding of English with science academic background is desirable.

*Applicants who have attended any aviation programme or course may have an advantage.

3. **Programme Features**

- 1.1 Practical experience with Fixed-wing and Helicopter Simulator
- 1.2 Tailor made "Training Day" organized by airlines, Government Department and pilot training company
- 1.3 Promoting an "Aviation English Culture" that most of the lectures, activities, briefing and debriefing will be conducted in English or bilingual
- 1.4 Training Visits to aviation related organizations and companies
- 1.5 Pilot attitude and mindset Outdoor Training Day Camp (9 Nov 2025 and 28 Dec 2025)(Insurance covered)
- 1.6 Aircraft Engineering Experience Workshop
- 1.7 CPP Session Special sharing session with intensive aviation topic by airline pilots or aviation professionals
- 1.8 Group Project to apply leadership, communication, teamwork, problem solving, can-to attitude, etc.

Important Note:

- *Visits are subject to approval of hosting organizations
- *Quota for each visit is limited and students may be required to undergo group or individual assessment
- *Candidates are required to submit health declaration for Pilot Attitude and Mindset Training Day Camp
- *Candidates are required to submit group visit report after each training visit
- *Candidates are required to dress in business attire for visit activities, training day, graduation ceremony and specific function or events

*Business Attire Standard:

Male - Black or dark colour suit, trousers, white colour shirt, tie and dark colour shoes Female – Black or dark colour suit, trousers, white colour shirt and dark colour shoes

4. Programme

Programme Period : 22 Oct 2025 – 24 Jul 2026

Classroom Normal Lecture/CPP Session: Wed 1930-2145

Note: There may be a chance the lectures may be changed to other weekday evening subject to classroom and instructors' availability with prior notice

5. Method of Training

Classroom lectures, assignments, reports, group presentation, visit and outdoor training session

Teaching language will be English or bilingual

6. Assessment

There are two examinations to be conducted at the end of each module respectively. Each module examination comprises 4 subjects.

Pass mark for each subject : 50 %

7. Recognition

Candidates who have passed the 8 subjects will be awarded "Certificate of Achievement" issued by HKACC. Candidates who have achieved 70% in each of the 8 subjects will be awarded "Certificate of Achievement with Distinction"

HKACC cadets who have completed the programme could apply for parallel recognition of all aviation subjects required for the Senior Cadet and Staff Cadet classifications.

8. Scholarships

Scholarships will be presented to the candidates with outstanding performance

9. Programme Fee

General Public (Required to enroll as HKACC Associate Member) : \$6000+\$30 HKACC Senior Member (21 of age or above as at the programme commencement date) : \$5000 UOWCHK College students (Required to enroll as HKACC Associate Member) : \$4500+\$30 HKACC Cadet Member (Below 21 of age as at the programme commencement date) : \$4000

^{*}Applicants are required to understand both English and Cantonese

^{*}Programme fee included an ebook (Helicopter Flight Dynamics)

^{*}The programme fee is used to cover the operating cost of programme, sim training, scholarship and graduation dinner, etc

^{*}All programme staff and instructors are **volunteers** without any remuneration

^{*}Programme fee will not be refundable after the applicants are accepted to join the programme

^{*}Enrolment fee of \$30 is applicable for applicants from **general public** and **UOW** College (Hong Kong) students to enroll as HKACC Associate Member (A separate cheque is required)

- 4 A printed A4 size essay of 150-200 words of the below topic

(Marked with the applicant's name as shown on the HKID Card)

Topic of Essay: Express in your own opinions how to establish the aviation culture for the Hong Kong teenagers by the HKSAR Government and aviation organizations

- 5 A cheque with correct amount payable to "HONG KONG AIR CADET CORPS" (A separate cheque is needed if the applicant needs to pay for the \$30 associate membership fee)
- *Applicants are advised to submit the applications **5 days prior to the deadline** in order to avoid any postage delay or other events that may delay the delivery of application.
- *Unsuccessful candidates will be notified to collect the cheque within two months after result announcement

Deadline for Application: 3 Oct 2024 Fri (No application will be accepted after the deadline date)

Short-listed applicants will be invited to attend the selection assessment in person:

- *Dress Code: Male White shirt with tie, black trouser & shoes / Female White shirt, black trouser & shoes
- *Assessment Criteria: Passion in Aviation 50% Appearance 25% English 25%
- *The AAEPH 2025-26 reserves the right for the final decision of the application result
