- 3. Shortlisted applicants will be invited to a selection exercise scheduled on 26 October 2019 at HKACC HQ / Aviation Club. The selection panel will be chaired by **Commanding Officer**.

- 5. All flying hours are recordable in pilot's logbook and countable towards future flying training, such as pursuing private pilot license, subject to relevant rules and regulations by the respective Civil Aviation Authorities. Participants with a valid New Zealand Class 1 / 2 medical certificate may be allowed to fly solo depending on individual's performance, and subject to the satisfaction of flying instructor(s) of the host flight training institute as well as other external factors.

Appendix II – Scholarship of the Overseas Session of Operation Kingbird 2019

a) Background

With the generous support from donors, the scholarship is able to support nine participants (including escort officer(s), if any) to pursue the operation.

b) Eligibility

The participants shall be required to complete solo flight during the Overseas Session of Operation Kingbird 2019 so as to be eligible for the scholarship. Dispensation may be given to those who could not complete first solo flight due to reasons beyond the control of the participants, but subject to the recommendation of Officer-in-charge Operation Kingbird 2019 (OIC) and decision of DCO Trg or his delegate.

c) Continual Assessment

Subsequent to a selection exercise, all participants will be continually assessed of their abilities to participate in Operation Kingbird with an aim to achieve first solo flight.

In the case that a particular member was identified unlikely to be suitable to pursue the operation during the assessment, he/she will be served a written reminder by the OIC detailing the area(s) of concern. The written reminder will be copied to the member's unit commander. If there's no improvement after a specified period, he/she shall discontinue from the operation.
